New exhibition season 2025/2026 Storylines – Photographic narratives in Clervaux's public spaces

Photography is much more than simply capturing moments: it is a means of storytelling, a mirror of emotions, change and memories. With the Storylines exhibition, Clervaux is transformed into an open picture book, in which personal, social and cultural narratives intertwine.

The exhibition presents works by international and national artists in public spaces:

- **Thomas Nondh Jansen** questions the meaning of home on the market square with a colourful series that shows that great stories often begin right on our doorstep.
- In the church arcades, **Olivier Schillen** highlights the phenomenon of mass tourism and opens up new perspectives on its influence on landscapes, cities and cultures.
- In the garden opposite the church, **Neckel Scholtus** invites visitors on a journey through his family history and stages his photographic self-portrait as a playful visual charade.
- In the arcades of the Grand-Rue, **Manon Diederich** documents the family home as a living archive where memories and temporalities intersect.
- Since 2018, Karin Schmuck has been devoting herself in the Brahaus garden to those places
 that were considered in ancient times to be the "ends of the world", thus creating a long-term
 project on borders and horizons.
- In the castle garden, **Pasha Rafiy** reflects on social conditions through the symbolic complexity of the bird, opening up poetic spaces for reflection and imagery.
- At the railway station, **Anna Krieps** approaches selfie culture as a stage for self-presentation in social media.

A special highlight: Clervaux - Cité de l'Image is expanding its collaboration with the Lycée Edward Steichen Clervaux (LESC) this year. For the first time, students have their own garden within the Cité de l'Image, which is being transformed into an exhibition space for their works — a lively dialogue between education and artistic practice.

With Storylines, Clervaux's urban space opens up to visual narratives that invite discovery, reflection and contemplation. The exhibition surprises, moves and inspires, and clearly shows that the most powerful images are those that give rise to new stories within us.
